

Volunteer of the Year Nomination Instructions & Examples

Nominee Categories

- <u>Civilian Volunteer of the Year</u> This award is for any volunteer associated with MCLB Barstow including dependents, retirees, veterans and civilian employees.
- Military Volunteer of the Year This award is for any Active Duty volunteer or Active Reservist.

Nominee Qualifications

- All nominees must be associated with MCLB Barstow (including Active Duty who are stationed at or live aboard MCLB Barstow, military dependents, civilian employees, and community members who volunteer on base).
- All nominees must have volunteered a minimum of 50 hours total in 2017.

Items Needed for Nomination Submission:

- ✓ Marine Corps Logistics Base Barstow Volunteer Nomination Form
 - o Form must be typed.
- ✓ Letter of Recommendation/Nomination
 - Must be typed in a Word document.
 - o Include why the volunteer deserves to be the Volunteer of the Year, examples of volunteering, total volunteering hours (including volunteer statistics with other units/organizations the volunteer may have), any awards earned, special recognition, etc.

Awardee Selection Process

All nominations are reviewed by a committee of volunteers with one representative from each of the following areas: Field Grade Officer, NCO, MCCS Staff Member, Military Spouse, and Civilian Employee. The Volunteer Program Coordinator does not participate in the selection process.

The Volunteer of the Year nominations are reviewed and weighed equally based on the following criteria:

• Total number of hours volunteer served in 2017 (50 hours minimum)

- Role of the volunteer
- Impact of the volunteer
- Volunteer's character and abilities(s)
- Volunteer's overall rating

Deadline for Submission:

- All nominations are due no later than 1600 on 9 March 2018.
- Nominations (to include the Nomination Form and a Letter of Recommendation/Nomination) must be submitted via email to Ashley Ignatz, Volunteer Coordinator: ashley.ignatz@usmc-mccs.org.
- Late nominations will NOT be accepted.
